Wrestling

The Lisle High School Wrestling Team completed a successful season during the 2010-2011 campaign. This year's team comprised of 32 young men with one of our largest freshman classes, 10 of them, in years. The Lions finished with an overall dual meet record of 15-6, and above .500 record, 6-5, in the Interstate 8 conference. At the JV conference tournament Lisle finished in 5th place led by 2nd place finisher Ben Buchelt and 3rd place finisher Jeff Chan. Fourth place finishers were Nick Honeysett, Andrew Bartol, and Tyler Martin while Brandon Vega, Justin Spangler, Anthony Szymczak, and Kyle Dwyer finished 5th. Rounding out the scoring for the young Lions was Tyler Schech who finished 6th.

On the varsity level, Lisle had very satisfying year. During the season the grapplers wrestled in four tournaments finishing in first place at Tolono Unity and the Lisle Invitational. The Lions captured 3rd at the Polo Invite and the IHSA regional tournament. At the Interstate 8 conference tournament Lisle finished a solid 4th. At these tournaments Lisle had several champions - AJ Pascente, 103: Tolono and Lisle, Ryan Kilroy, 112: Tolono and Lisle, Brad Blechschmidt, 125: Tolono and Regionals, Brian Czyl, 130: I-8 and Regionals, Scott Sheahan, 140: Tolono and Lisle, and Brandon Wolak, 152: Polo, Lisle, I-8 and Regionals. Lisle had other wrestlers that placed at the tournaments including Tyler Young, 119, Cameron Castellanos, 160, and Tom Keleher, 285.

The Lisle wrestling team had three All Interstate 8 Conference wrestlers: Brad Blechschmidt who finished 2nd and two conference champions Brian Czyl and Brandon Wolak. At the IHSA regional

tournament Lisle crowned three champions: Brad Blechschmidt, Brian Czyl and Brandon Wolak, which qualified them for the IHSA sectional tournament. Finishing third and also qualifying for the sectional tourney were AJ Pascente, Ryan Kilroy and Cameron Castellanos. At the sectional tourney, Ryan Kilroy finished 3rd and qualified for the IHSA state tournament at the University of Illinois. Just missing state qualification was Brad Blechschmidt who finished fourth. Ryan went 1-2 at the state tourney, and was one match away from being a state place winner.

Overall, the Lisle Wrestling team had a great season, but we will miss our three Senior Captains Scott Sheahan, Brandon Wolak and Cameron Castellanos. The coaching staff wishes them the best of luck in their future endeavors.

Girls Varsity Basketball

It was a good season for the Varsity Lady Lions Basketball team. The team finished with an overall record of 18-11. They finished in a tie for second place in the conference with Peotone with a conference record of 9-2, one game behind conference champion Westmont. The season ended with the lions facing conference champion Westmont in the regional championship game. After leading by three at half time, Westmont pulled away in the second half and ended up winning 36-30. The Lady Lions also fared well in the Lisle Christmas cage Classic as they took a fourth place finish in the prestigious 16 team tournament. The team gained valuable experience playing in some very big games this season. Hopefully with this experience and the return of a number of players, who are motivated to improve the Lady Lions Basketball program will be able to reach greater heights.

The team also had a number of players garner individual awards throughout the season. (Junior) Shelby Kretmann was selected as a member of the all tournament team at Burlington Central Thanksgiving Tourney. Darian Payne (Junior) was selected as a member of the all tournament team at the Lisle Cage Classic. Kretmann, Payne, and (Senior) Tara Sarb were also selected as members of the Interstate Eight all-conference team.

Girls Sophomore Basketball

The girls sophomore basketball team finished the season with a 5-16 record. Members of the team included: freshman Sierra Birdsell and sophomores Amy Breihan, Candace Harris, Kristin Holub, Angie Ngo, Vanessa Roach, Jessica Sedlacek, Abby Tarasewicz, Christine Young, and Ashleigh Zurek. Val Melo moved up from the freshmen team late in the season and played some minutes. Due to some injuries at the varsity level, Amy Breihan and Abby Tarasewicz were moved up to the varsity team late in the season and saw some game minutes as well.

Although their record doesn't show it, the girls improved tremendously over the course of the season. They developed their individual basketball skills while learning a new offensive system. They accomplished many of the goals they had established at the beginning of the season and had fun playing together as a team. Special mention should be made for sophomore Catherine Smith who served as manager for the team. She did an outstanding job making sure practices ran smoothly and assisted on the bench during games. Boys Varsity Basketball

The conference record of 3-8 and an overall record of 10-20 were somewhat disappointing to the boy's basketball team, but the Lions regrouped in post-season play beating Chicago Richards and arch rival Westmont in front of large home crowds during regionals. The Lions were lead by All Conference players Chris Wray and Phil Palicka who combined to average 25 point and 16 rebounds a game this season. In addition to Seniors Palicka and Wray, Lisle also got important contributions from Senior point guard Anthony Vacco and sharp shooter Kyle Frazier. All total the Lions will say goodbye to 9 seniors this year, but look to get contributions from returning Juniors Pat Webb, Kazim Kahn, Parker Murray, and Dylan Sinn next season.

Boys Sophomore Basketball

The Boys Sophomore basketball season endured lots of bumps along their journey this season resulting with a 9-15 over all record and 6-5 in conference. Leading the way for the Lions were Matt Bucher with 11 points and Jonny Parrillo 10 points per game. Even though the record doesn't look great the Lions battled each time they stepped on the court, playing hard until the final buzzer. Boys Freshman Basketball

The freshmen boys' basketball team concluded the 2010-11 campaign with an exhilarating victory over the Walther Lutheran Broncos to finish the season at 12-11 and 6-4 in the Interstate Eight. In addition to the 23 "A" games the team competed in a 10-game "B" schedule and

finished 5-5 in those games. The team was comprised of 12 young men who worked hard and competed on a daily basis. The season began with a win and two losses in the Chicago Christian Thanksgiving Tournament. After an extended break at Christmas the Lions came back strong and defeated Timothy Christian, avenging an opening day 16 point loss to the Trojans. This was the first of three rematches in which the Lions avenged losses to the same team earlier in the season. The boys took those early losses hard and challenged themselves to get better in practice. Shortly after the New Year the freshmen took third place in the I-8 freshmen tournament hosted by Sandwich. Anne Begley's 1121 and Rebekkah Houda's 1088 placed them at 10th and 15th respectively. The Lions then placed 7th of 10 at the Hinsdale Central Tournament and 19th of 32 at the Guilford Invitational. At the Hinsdale Tournament, Haley Locher set her personal best twice as she finished with a 973. Shelby Jensen's season high 222 helped to her to

lead the Lions with a 1013. Lisle then took top honors as they hosted Herscher and Peotone; Begley's 592 and Locher's 584 led the way as Lisle had the four highest series of the day among the teams. The Lions' top individual performance came at the Dixon Invitational as Houda posted a 719 morning series on her way to taking 3rd overall and leading the Lions to a 14th place finish among the 24 teams. At Sectionals the Lions showed what they were really made of and had their most consistent day of the year. Lisle followed up a 2596 morning session with a 2613 afternoon to finish 7th of 18 teams. Rebekkah Houda and Melanie Early led the Lions with 178 and 177 averages respectively.
